ATTN: MEMBERS OF THE AVIATION SAFETY REGULATION REVIEW

Dear Sirs,

As a participant in the aviation industry for the last 44 years maintaining aircraft and operating them for nearly 10 years during the eighties and early nineties it is very gratifying to finally see some possible relief about to arrive in an industry that has so slowly declined and reached a point of near total destruction.

I will keep my letter brief as the main purpose is to support the submission presented by AMROBA, of which my company is an active member of.

A further submission was given to Senator David Fawcett during his visit to Cairns with representatives of the Cairns Aviation Skills Centre and Australasian Aviation Group Cairns of which I am the chairman of the first and member of the latter.

I only hope that this review can bring forward ideas and suggestions that can be taken by the government and implemented to help to breathe new life into an industry that has been slowly destroyed in the last few years by a Civil Aviation Safety Authority generating regulations that are so confusing that even their own staff have varying interpretations which they individually enforce and fine an industry participant for failure to understand the regulations fully.

I fully support the idea of a management committee that can oversee the running of CASA and the implementation of committee of review that can honestly and openly review and difference that may occur between an industry member and CASA or a member of their staff. This would alleviate the massive costs occurred and make it impossible for CASA to constantly defer a matter until the operator finally runs out of money.

I look forward to reading your finally report on this matter
