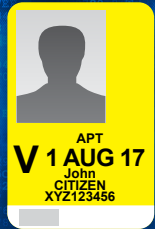




Need a visitor identification card (VIC)?

How to verify your identity



New identity verification requirements for the issue of VICs from 1 August 2017

A VIC can be issued only by a VIC issuer.

A VIC can be issued if:

- you need to enter the secure area of a security controlled airport for a lawful purpose; and
- you will be supervised by the holder of a valid aviation security identification card (ASIC) while in the area.

You must give the VIC issuer a written statement of the reasons why you need to enter the secure area.

To be issued with a VIC, a VIC issuer must verify your identity.

From 1 August 2017, if you require a VIC, you will need to present to a VIC issuer with an original identification document that must:

- be government issued;
- contain your photo and signature; and
- be current and valid.

E.g. Driver licence, Australian or foreign passport, proof of age card.

If you have been refused an ASIC, you must inform the VIC issuer.

Visitors to secure areas or zones must be supervised by a valid ASIC holder at all times.
