The Australian Government is supporting the celebrations not only through a range of activities delivered by WA state agency partners but also with an additional air freighter and ferry services.

25 April also marks ANZAC Day, with our communities honouring the day with traditional Dawn Services on Christmas and Cocos Islands.

The Dawn Service is a time for the community to come together to honour the courage, sacrifice and legacy of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, and to reflect on the role our own communities have played in our country's military heritage. Following my time on Cocos, I will then travel to Perth for meetings with key stakeholders on a range of issues including emergency management, flights and freight.

Latest News

Cocos receives stamp of approval from Australia Post



In honour of the 40th Anniversary of the Act of Self Determination for the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, Australia Post is releasing new stamps to commemorate this significant occasion.

Two stamps will be available to the public from 7 May, with both stamps specifically designed to reflect Cocos

Malay history and the historic vote. The stamps will be available online from the Australia Post website: <u>Shop</u> <u>Collectables Stamp Issues Online (auspost.com.au)</u>

The first stamp design represents both the Jukong, the traditional sea craft of the Cocos Islanders, and the number 40, representing the forty years since the referendum took place.

The second design is based on the original ballot paper for the 1984 referendum. Voters were encouraged to vote on one of three diagrammatic options.

The first, representing complete independence of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, showed a single figure in traditional Cocos Malay dress.

The second, representing integration with Australia, depicted two figures arm in arm, as shown on the stamp, one in Cocos Malay dress, the other in Australian European dress.

The third diagram, which indicated free association with Australia, showed the two figures standing side by side without touching.

Museum staff return to Cocos

WA Museum's Manager, Special Projects, Tim Eastwood will be on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands from 16 to 30 April continuing the delivery of projects identified as important to the community.

In time for the Act of Self Determination 40th anniversary celebrations, the Home Island Museum will be receiving an internal make-over with improvements to display material and hanging space to enhance the visitor experience.

In February 2024, as part of the Jukong Restoration Project, Cocos Elder Nek Callum commenced restoration works on the *Lantar Pujeh*, one of the smallest boats. Nek Su will be providing his metal working expertise in the fabrication of hardware and trims for the jukongs, commencing later this month.

An open day at the Chula Shed has been planned for 27 April to enable residents and visitors to see the

restoration works in progress. Five historic boats have been relocated to the shed for the purpose of protection and ongoing preservation. Time-lapse photography is also in place to enable a documentary record of this important conservation program to be captured.

Throughout the project, young people can benefit from the Elders sharing their knowledge, expertise and skills.

The jukong restoration project is a collaborative effort between the WA Museum through Australian Government funding and the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

A brochure is also being prepared by WA Museum to capture a timeline history of Cocos through to the Act of Self Determination 40th anniversary. Collation of content and images for the brochure is under way. When finalised, printed copies of the brochure will be distributed to all CKI residents, including a Cocos-Malay translation. Visitors will also be able to collect the brochure from the Home Island Museum, as well as a digital version available online to download. Further details on the brochure will be included in my next newsletter.



Honouring our brave police officers

On 18 April, I was privileged to present three Australian Federal Police officers with citations for their roles in the rescue of a man who was swept out to sea from Lily Beach last year.

Five officers were included in the Foundation Day Honours List for their involvement in the rescue, with Detective Leading Senior Constable Erin McEwan and Constable Charlee Hopkins, having since moved away from Christmas Island.

I was very pleased to be able to present the remaining three officers with their citations, in a ceremony at the Christmas Island Police Station. Special Member Dylan McNamara was awarded the Commissioner's Group Citation for Bravery. This award recognises an act of bravery, with an officer risking their own safety to save or protect another person.

Leading Constable Tay Yeow and Constable Braidee Bell were awarded the Commissioner's Group Citation for Conspicuous Conduct, which honours individuals who have shown outstanding dedication to their duties, demanding tenacity of the highest order.

I'd like to thank the AFP officers involved in the rescue for their selfless and dedicated actions. Thank you for your service and to all AFP officers who play an invaluable role in keeping our community safe.

An Ace visit from Volleyball Western Australia

Aspiring volleyball players, coaches, umpires, and those just looking for a fun activity – were some of the lucky Christmas and Cocos Island residents who took part in a recent series of volleyball workshops, community, and school sessions led by Perth Steel captain and Level 2-State Coach Shelby Maher.

Between 27 February and 8 March 2024, Coach Maher delivered numerous volleyball sessions to the local schools and communities on Christmas and Cocos Islands, with opportunities for children and adults to learn and participate.

"It's exciting to see the kids embrace the sport in their community and make it an inclusive environment for everyone," Coach Maher said.

While on island, Ms Maher interacted with more than 400 volleyballers including students ranging from Pre-Primary to Year 12, parents, schoolteachers, volleyball coaches, and local Shire representatives.

Two of the main sessions delivered at the Christmas Island District High School were to the school's representative teams, who have a long-standing commitment to the sport.

Both boys and girls won the A-Division School Sport WA Country Championships in 2023, with the boys winning it for the fourth consecutive time.

"The students have great talent to offer, and I can't wait to see them show off those skills at Country School's Cup coming up in June" detailed Shelby, whose expertise on the island was helpful in their preparation for the 2024 competition, where both teams are favourites to take the championship once again!

"Volleyball WA would like to thank our government funding partners for the chance to support these initiatives. We are grateful for the opportunities to engage communities with volleyball at various levels, and we hope to inspire a love for the sport and encourage individuals of all backgrounds to come together and enjoy the benefits of physical activity and teamwork," said Robyn Kuhl, CEO of Volleyball WA.

Air Services

The Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts is approaching the market to secure an air services partner to deliver regular passenger and freight transport services to Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

With Virgin Australia's current contract reaching the end of its term in late 2025, the Australian Government is required to re-approach the market for the provision of air services to the Indian Ocean Territories (IOT).

The request for tender (RFT), which is now open, was informed by consultation with the IOT community through a comprehensive survey of air services conducted in the second half of 2023.

Airfare and pricing, service reliability, seat availability, baggage limits and speed of recovery services were identified as key priorities by the community.

The RFT will seek proposals to deliver both passenger and air freight services to the IOT for a period of five years, with two possible two-year extension options.

The procurement of an air service partner is a priority for the Australian Government which provides significant investment in underwriting air services to the IOT.

The RFT closes at 12pm (EST), 14 June 2024. For more information about the RFT, visit <u>Austender.gov.au</u>.

The IOTHS delivers a primary and acute health care service in two of Australia's most remote and most spectacular settings - Christmas Island (CI) and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI). IOTHS includes a 24 hour eight bed hospital and primary care facility on CI and clinics on Home and West Islands in the CKI. The IOTHS is committed to "Working with our communities to keep us healthy for the whole of our lives".

The key responsibilities of the Cleaner CKI are to provide a high quality cleaning service to the health clinics on Home Island and West Island.

Our ideal candidate will have previous cleaning experience and familiarity with associated equipment the demonstrated ability to organise work and time priorities efficiently with limited supervision and knowledge of infection control standards and how they apply to a health care environment. Further, the successful candidate will have experience with maintaining confidentiality and working in sensitive environments and a demonstrated knowledge of Work Health and Safety requirements specific to the required work environment.

Applicants with a Certificate II in Cleaning, basic computer literacy, understanding of safe manual handling techniques, and the ability to communicate effectively in Cocos Malay and/or in cross cultural contexts will be well regarded.
