Following my time on Cocos, I had a productive visit to the mainland – where I oversaw Virgin Australia Regional Airlines' passenger air services and freight handling, undertook emergency management training and was able to have in-person discussions around future priorities for our region.

Act of Self Determination Day 40th anniversary celebrations







Celebrations to mark the 40th anniversary of the Act of Self Determination for the Cocos Islands were held at the end of last month. I was able to spend time on Home Island experiencing the rich traditions and culture of Cocos to mark this momentous occasion.

It was fantastic to see a strong turn-out to the events, with young and old alike enjoying the football matches and clinics, as well the performances by visiting music and dance collective Salama Odyssey.

The jukong races were a highlight, with spectators cheering on those involved. Congratulations to the race winners, and to all those who took part.

I would like to take a moment to thank everyone involved in putting on these events, in particular the Shire of Cocos Keeling Islands, PKPK, community groups, volunteers, our Western Australian service partners, as well as to the community who supported the celebrations.

Our air services - from the ground, up

During my recent visit to Perth, I had the opportunity to view Virgin Australia Regional Airlines' (VARA) air services operations for the Indian Ocean Territories.

Reliable passenger and freight services are essential for our region so I was pleased to discuss and observe the ways in which VARA and its staff and contractors run check-in, baggage handling, and freight processes for our region.

This first-hand experience is informing ongoing discussions with VARA about ways to improve baggage and freight handling on the services to Christmas and Cocos Islands.

I was also able to discuss the larger freighter aircraft which is set to begin operation on 14 June this year, with the capacity to carry an additional four to five tonnes of freight per fortnight to the IOT. Another benefit of the larger freighter is a change to Dangerous Goods restrictions, which will make the transport of safety flares by air much easier. The Emergency Management Committees for Christmas and Cocos Islands had previously flagged the importance of community members being able to easily access flares, so this is a welcome development. While the new freighter is a fantastic step towards easing some of our most immediate supply chain pressures, it's important to continue to look for further opportunities to improve our freight and passenger air services.

The recent release of the supply chain review – a priority in the IOT RDO 2030 Strategic Regional Plan, puts freight and supply chains front and centre of the agenda for our region, with the report and its recommendations now with the Australian Government for consideration.

We aim to have further information in the coming weeks about how VARA and the Australian Government will seek to continue to monitor and improve air services to the IOT.

A reminder as well that the Australian Government has supported an additional passenger flight on 29 June for the IOT, so take advantage of this extra service and capacity for your upcoming travel.





Update on CI tower crane replacement project



During a recent visit to Christmas Island by senior staff from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts, I hosted a roundtable discussion on the replacement of the Flying Fish Cove tower crane.

The Australian Government is engaging experts to provide technical advice and review documentation that has been previously developed for this project to ensure the replacement crane is fit-for-purpose.

Key stakeholders and port users were involved in the discussion on Christmas Island, with determining and sourcing a suitable replacement crane being the next step for the project.

Careful planning will be undertaken to ensure the efficient delivery of this project with minimal disruption to the crane service. In the meantime, the existing

tower crane underwent minor repairs following the recent severe storm and is operating as normal.

The Department is managing the project and understands the criticality of the crane to the Christmas Island community and stakeholders. Regular updates will be provided to the community as the project is progressed. Please submit any questions regarding this project to the Office of the Administrator on Christmas Island.

Investing in water sustainability on Christmas Island

The final stage of the Christmas Island Summit to Drumsite water main replacement project is expected to commence in 2025-26, with the Australian Government providing \$6.8 million in funding in the 2024 Federal Budget.

Stage one of the water main replacement was successfully completed in 2023 with 4km of water main commencing from the Summit tank being replaced. The replacement of the remaining 1.4km of water main to finalise the connection through to Drumsite tank will help to ensure water sustainability on the island.

Until the final stage is completed, Water Corporation maintains a leak inspection program on the remaining section of main to reduce losses from the community's water supply.

During a recent visit to Christmas Island, Adam Stankevicius, IOT Assistant Secretary took the opportunity to inspect the island's main water source at Jedda Cave located in the National Park. Danielle Scott, Water Corporation's Team Leader Operations Support IOT provided Adam and other departmental representatives with an overview of the water extraction process from Jedda Cave and its treatment to ensure the drinking water the community receives meets Australian water quality guidelines.

Water, Our Precious Resource





The students of Cocos (Keeling) Islands District High School are now 'full bottle' on the importance of water on the islands, after taking part in the 'Water, Our Precious Resource' education program. The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER), along with the Shire of CKI, and Water Corporation, recently visited both the Home and West Island campuses to share information and knowledge with the local students.

On Home Island, lessons focused on extracting seawater through the four bores at Sandy Point, and took students on the journey of the water through the desalination process to the tap. Students also studied the importance of protecting the water lens under the Kampong, which is the back-up water source.

The West Island focus was on how the community's drinking water comes from the airport runway lens and this water's treatment after being extracted from the two galleries, one on either side of the airport terminal. Students also played board games showing them the process of desalination, the way their water will be treated in the future.

DWER services in the Indian Ocean Territories are funded by the Australian Government.

Improving freight services for Indian Ocean Territories

I am pleased to inform the community that there will be additional freight capacity to meet the needs of the Indian Ocean Territories (IOT) communities going forward, through the use of a larger aircraft for the regular air freighter service.

Commencing in June 2024, the Australian Government's commercial partners will be using a Boeing B737-800 freighter aircraft for the service to Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

The new freight payload capacity is some 19 tonnes, which is an approximate increase of four to five tonnes per fortnight, when compared to the existing freighter aircraft. Freighter services will continue on a fortnightly basis.

I know the community will welcome the increased capacity for this essential service.

The final service using the existing plane is scheduled to take place on 24 May 2024, with the larger capacity new freighter coming into service for the scheduled 14 June 2024 circuit. Due to the change in the aircraft and operational requirements, adjustments were required

to the freighter schedules as per Virgin Australia's notice dated 8th May 2024.

IOT freight and passenger air services are underwritten by the Australian Government, which provides significant investment in air services to CI and CKI, supporting efficient and regular supply chains to our remote region.

I am committed to better outcomes for the IOT air services, and will continue to monitor and engage with the community, stakeholders and Virgin Australia.

My thanks to our commercial partners who continue to work with Government to provide these services across the IOT.

The freighter capacity is subject to variation depending on operational conditions.

The key responsibilities of the NUM are to lead and manage the multi-disciplinary IOTHS workforce on CKI in the delivery of high quality evidenced based health services to achieve optimal patient outcomes within a remote and multicultural environment. The NUM plays a key role in the IOTHS leadership team and is responsible the effective use of human, and material resources within a remote and multicultural environment.

Our ideal applicant will possess advanced clinical skills, knowledge and previous experience in the application and practice of Remote Area Nurse competencies specific to remote clinics, with well-developed communication, analytical, problem solving and writing skills. Further the applicant will demonstrate a commitment to supporting professional development, improving health outcomes in a remote multi-cultural environment, and have a sound understanding of related service delivery issues.

Previous relevant experience in the development and delivery of health care using primary health principles and primary health care programs, demonstrated management and leadership skills in a multidisciplinary organisation and a sound understanding of human resources and financial management are also essential.
