Furthermore, it is crucial to acknowledge that news media outlets also play a significant role in spreading misinformation and disinformation. To ensure a comprehensive and consistent approach, news media should also be subject to the same obligations and standards as digital platforms. This would require news media organizations to adopt responsible reporting practices, fact-check their content, and provide accurate and unbiased information to the public.

In conclusion, while acknowledging the importance of combating misinformation and disinformation, I urge you to carefully consider the potential impact of the proposed legislation on freedom of speech, privacy, and the digital industry's ability to innovate. A balanced approach that encourages collaboration and education, while subjecting news media to the same

obligations and standards, may prove more effective in addressing this complex issue while preserving our democratic values. Such an approach would ensure a comprehensive and consistent framework for combating misinformation and disinformation, regardless of the medium through which it is disseminated.
