Statement of Compatibility

The statement must assess the compatibility of the proposed legislation with the rights and freedoms recognised in the seven core international human rights treaties that Australia has ratified, including the ICCPR.

Very simply put the Bill allows the ACMA too much power and I fundamentally oppose this Bill.
