## **RE: Communications Legislation Amendment (Combatting Misinformation and Disinformation) Bill 2023**

I strongly oppose this Bill.

This proposed legislation places extreme limitations on the freedom of speech of the Australian people while exempting governments, media and educational institutions from the same limitations. This can only lead to a situation where the population are only given one side of a story that suits the political agenda of the government of the day, and any opposition can easily be labelled "misinformation" or "disinformation", the definition of which is unclear. What is clear is that the government (ACMA) will be the arbiter of that definition which will likely be fluid depending on the situation. This will shift any and all power from the people to the government, giving them absolute power over all public information.
