Communications Legislation Amendment (Combatting misinformation and Disinformation) Bill 2023

I strongly disagree with the implementation of this Bill for the following reasons:

- 1. Suppressing information of any kind is suppressing free speech. Information is constantly changing; some is reliable and some is not. How does suppressing information help Australians?
- 2. A healthy democracy needs freedom of speech where ideas can be discussed and debated, and previously unseen solutions found.
- 3. Fringe views rarely gain momentum. People should be allowed to be exposed to all discussions on a topic and then decide for themselves what to be believe. We need a market place of ideas in order to get a broad view of a topic.
- 4. Governments and their authorized bodies should never be given the power to decide what is or is not true. Governments have lied in the past (Tampa, Weapons of Mass destruction).
- 5. This new Bill will allow ACMA to impose significant penalties on social media platforms (and individuals using those platforms) if they allow perceived misinformation/disinformation. Senator Alex Antic has discovered through Freedom of Information that the Australian government intervened 4000 times to restrict or censor posts on various social media platforms about Covid-19, many of which have since been shown to be correct. This must not happen again.
