I think a great strength of western democracy is free speech and the ability to debate diverse opinions. Sometimes facts are not so black and white and we need to openly debate the facts and openly contest if we have contrary evidence.

This proposed "Misinformation Bill" is disgraceful. Intended or not, it will damage free speech. Free speech is a non-negotiable human right and must be safeguarded.

The bill states that "misinformation" includes that which leads to 'harm', including psychological harm. But this is very subjective. What someone perceives as harmful, another may perceive as helpful, and something others need to hear for their own good. It is simply not possible for governments to police such subjectivity.
