I am not in harms way with a free speech on the internet. But I am convinced the proposed 'Misinformation Bill' is wrongheaded and dangerous, putting all Australians that use the internet in harms way.

Even social media companies such as Meta and Twitter have voiced their concerns over the proposed law because it's easy to see how the power given to the ACMA could be abused. Meta said that the law would have a "chilling" effect on free speech.
