

- The Air Navigation (Aircraft Noise) Regulations 2018 require commercial drone users to obtain a noise approval from the department under certain conditions.
- To date, two companies have been granted noise approval for large-scale drone delivery operations:
 - Wing Aviation (Logan / Ormeau / Springfield in Queensland, and northern Canberra)
 - Swoop Aero (South Burnett and Goondiwindi in Queensland and Moree Plains / Gwydir / Inverell in NSW).
- The department has also issued noise approvals for approximately 135 smaller operations for activities including construction inspection, photography and drone pilot training in 2023.



Thank you for your response. I have forwarded your street address to Wing.

Prior to commencing deliveries in your area, Wing actively engaged in stakeholder activities, including pamphlet deliveries to letter boxes in the intended delivery suburbs and held pop up stalls.

Whilst Wing aren't currently delivering to households in Canberra at the moment, their drone noise approval permits them to operate drones for the activities of: delivering; testing; and for demonstrations purposes; including restrictions that they must only fly in daylight and during the following times:

- Weekdays, from 7.30am to 7.00pm
- Saturdays, from 8.00am to 7.00pm
- Sundays, from 9.00am to 7.00pm

Regarding your privacy concerns, Wing's aircraft are equipped with low-resolution, black-and-white cameras used primarily to assist with navigation and to help ensure the safety and reliability of operations. At no time is there a live feed of images from the cameras to anyone — including the pilots supervising flights. They cannot be pointed or zoomed to view objects on the ground, and people are not recognisable while the drone flies to its delivery destination. When making a delivery to a person's front or backyard, Wing drones only hover at seven metres, over the designated delivery zone of the customer who requested the delivery. Wing's aircraft use cameras in their navigation systems to confirm terrain data and for safety purposes.

I am sorry to hear of your noise and privacy concerns around drone use over your home.

While Wing had ceased its delivery service in the ACT, it maintains its nest in Mitchell \$47G(1)(a) However, it is possible that the drone you heard was not Wing's and unfortunately it is not possible for us, based on the information you provided, to confirm the purpose of the drone flights you saw.

Commercial drone operators may undertake a range of services, including at night, for different purposes, including construction, building maintenance, environmental or safety assessment, and more. Drones have also become a critical element in almost every aspect of emergency operations, e.g. policing.

The department recognises community concerns on drone use, including around noise, privacy, security, and environmental impacts. Accordingly, it is working to address these through policy and regulatory development that can evolve as the technology use grows and changes.

Some information that may help:

- Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) safety rules apply for recreational drone operators including ensuring drones are at least 30m away from other people. See Drone rules | Civil Aviation Safety Authority (casa.gov.au) for further information. If you believe that the drone operator has broken the drone safety rules, you can report it to CASA: Drone complaints | Civil Aviation Safety Authority (casa.gov.au). Note: that CASA cannot enforce privacy related matters.
- While the Privacy Act 1988 does not cover camera (or drone) users operating in a private capacity, the Office for the Australian Information Commissioner provides advice for those concerned with neighbours using drone cameras.
