ACCC reports of vehicle safety issues due to cracked pistons in specified vehicles

As part of its work administering the <u>Road Vehicle Standards (RVS) legislation</u>, the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts (the Department) maintains databases of <u>reports</u> since 2016 submitted by members of the public, industry and other regulators regarding potential vehicle safety issues or alleged non-compliance with RVS legislation.

This document provides the number of such safety reports received by the Department from the Australian Competition & Consumer Commission (the ACCC), for the purpose of being recorded in the Department's databases, in relation to cracked pistons in specified vehicles.
