

Key Points:

- In the 2022-23 October Budget, the Australian Government committed administered funding
 of up to \$349.9 million for the Investing in Our Communities Program (the program) over
 five financial years from 2022-23 to 2026-27. The one-off, closed, non-competitive program
 will deliver the Australian Government's 2022 election commitments and Community
 Development Grants Programme commitments identified through the 2022 Pre-election
 Fiscal Outlook (PEFO) of up to \$5 million.
- 2. The key objective of the program is to build resilient communities and increase community liveability by providing grants for infrastructure projects. The program will deliver on this objective by funding community and sporting infrastructure, open space improvements and other community priority projects that will drive economic opportunity and/or provide improved amenity, accessibility and liveability outcomes.

- 8. An indicative list of commitments intended to be funded by the program was agreed as part of the 2022-23 October Budget process. Following further review and consultations with your office, the department has updated the list including proposed transfer of a number of projects where they have been identified as ineligible under grant opportunity guidelines and/or were more suited to delivery by other portfolios. The updated list of commitments, including those identified for allocation to other portfolios, is at Attachment E. Letters addressed to relevant Ministers to transfer projects is provided at Attachment F, s 22
- 9. If you agree to the updated commitments list \$ 22 , we will prepare a letter to the Prime Minister to advise him of the confirmed commitment list for the Investing in Our Communities Program. This will provide policy authority for the invitations to be issued under the program.

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
