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**regional Precincts and Partnerships Program:**

6. The Government announced the rPPP in the October 2022-23 Budget, with funding of \$400 million over three years from 2023-24. The program is currently administered by the Business Grants Hub (the Hub) in batches based on Independent Expert Panel assessment capacity and date application received, in the Department of Industry, Science and Resources.
7. The rPPP is an open, non-competitive grant program, with proposals batched and assessed at least twice per financial year. The program has two funding streams, Stream One to support precinct development and planning (grant value between \$500,000 and \$5 million) and Stream Two (grant value between \$5 million and \$50 million) to support precinct delivery.

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8. The objectives of the program and intended outcomes are outlined in the rPPP Grant Opportunity Guidelines **Attachment G**.

### **Application assessment and policy analysis**

9. The rPPP opened for applications on 24 August 2023 (**MS23-003750 refers**), with the first batch of assessments taken as at 31 October 2023. A total of 18 eligible Stream One applications and three eligible Stream Two applications were received by this date.
10. As per the approved and published grant opportunity guidelines (**MS23-003750 refers**), eligible applications were provided to the Independent Expert Panel (the Panel) to assess the merit of applications against the assessment criteria (**MS23-003556 refers**). The Panel assessed 15 Stream One and two Stream Two proposals as meritorious, with a total funding envelope of \$76 million.
11. In line with the process outlined in the Grant Opportunity Guidelines, the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts has undertaken a policy analysis of the 15 meritorious proposals, taking into consideration: The Panel's assessment; Government's approach to regional investment as outlined in the Regional Investment Framework; alignment with Government's priorities; available funding; balance of projects between each Stream; geographic spread; and precinct type.
12. The department has identified 9 applications that best align with the above requirements, to be considered for future funding: 8 Stream One applications and 1 Stream Two proposal, amounting to total funding of \$38.56 million. The department has recommended partial funding for the Stream Two proposal.
13. The department's assessment for each meritorious proposal is provided in **Attachments B1 to B15**. These include an overview of key precinct information, outcomes of the Panel assessment, and a ministerial decision-making table with space for recording your decision, and whether you wish to fund any of these proposals at this stage.
14. As outlined in the Grant Opportunity Guidelines, your decision should consider the department's advice, available funding and where necessary, and may consider advice from relevant Ministers for meritorious proposals relevant to their specific portfolio responsibilities.
15. The 2023-24 program allocation of \$100 million allows for funding of all meritorious Batch One proposals (\$76 million) should this be your preference. However, Batch One is a relatively small batch (18 proposals, 15 of which were considered meritorious) and should all 15 applications be funded, the available program funding may be insufficient for the demand of future batches.

### **Merits of the proposed applications**

16. The department is satisfied the recommended projects fall within the available funding envelope, represent value for money and are an efficient, effective, economical and ethical use of resources.

### **Decision making**

17. As the decision maker for the program, you have the final decision about which projects will be funded, the level of funding offered to each applicant and any conditions which you may want to apply to the funding offer.
18. You must record your decisions and any terms and conditions to be applied in **Attachments B1 – B15**, should you wish to progress with selecting successful proposals at this time.

**Grants in the Minister's electorate**

19. There are no recommended nor meritorious grants within your electorate. Consistent with the CGRGs, you may approve grants within your own electorate. Where you exercise the role of approver for grants awarded in your own electorate, you must write to the Minister for Finance advising of the details.

**Approving grants that are not recommended by the department**

20. As the decision maker you may approve meritorious grants not recommended by the department.
21. Under the rPPP Grant Opportunity guidelines, applicants cannot use funding from other Commonwealth funds towards the same project. The department has reviewed the recommended projects against the department's other community infrastructure grants program funding and the Australian Government's Disaster Ready Fund to identify potential funding duplication. If you choose to select grants not recommended by the department, a review of any potential funding duplication will be conducted and provided to your office.
22. The department also reviewed meritorious projects against proposed Growing Regions Round 1 applications and no duplication within recommended projects exists. However, there is a risk of duplication of funding should you chose to fund projects not recommended by the department under the rPPP or the Growing Regions program. rPPP projects which have also applied in Growing Regions Round 1 are highlighted in the relevant proposal attachments.
23. Consistent with the CGRGs, you are required to report annually to the Minister for Finance on all instances where you have decided to approve a particular grant which was not recommended for funding. The report must include a brief statement of reasons and be provided to the Minister for Finance by 31 March each year for the preceding calendar year.

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**Ongoing administration**

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33. As at 1 May 2024, an additional 206 applications have been received by the Hub since the first batch was collated. Approximately 50 of these are currently in assessment as 'Batch Two', expected to be provided to you for decision in July 2024 following assessment by the Panel in late June, due to Panel availability. The total funding requested to date for all applications submitted (including all in Batch One) is over \$1.3 billion which means the three-year program is \$800 million oversubscribed within the first year of opening.

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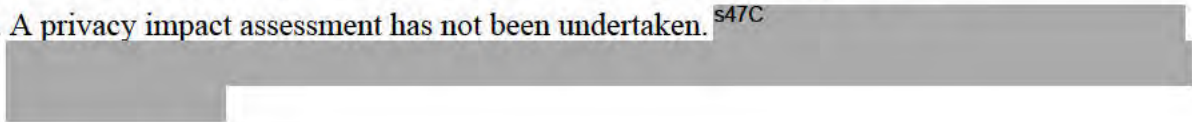
**Stakeholder Implications:**

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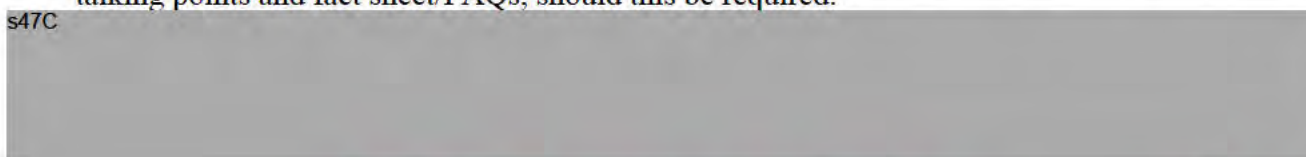

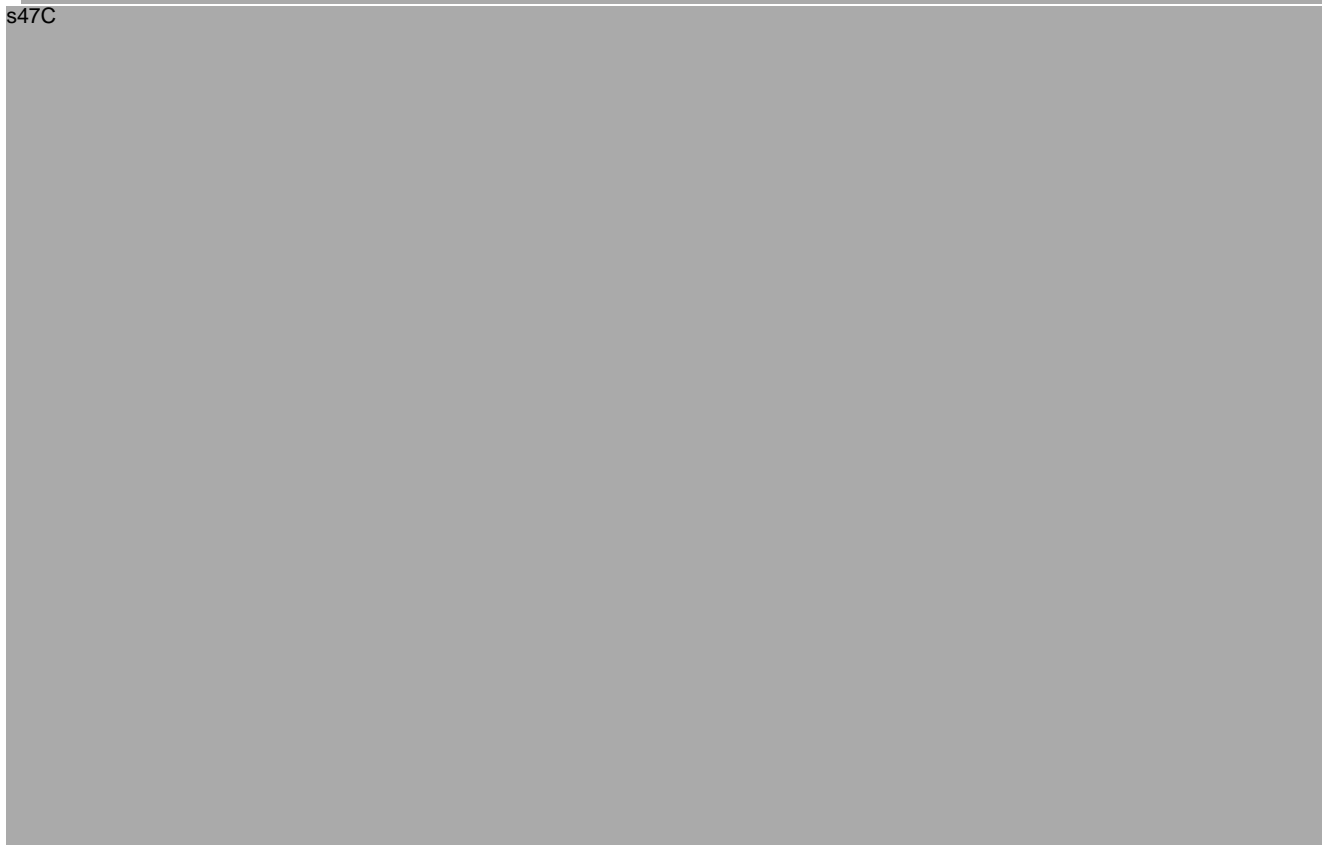

**Growing Regions Program**

8. The program was announced in the October 2022-23 Budget with \$600 million for two rounds over three years from 2023-24 for the program to drive regional economic prosperity by providing access to funding for capital works for community infrastructure across Australia’s rural and regional areas. The program is currently administered by the Business Grants Hub (BGH) within the Department of Industry, Science and Resources (DISR).

9. The objectives of the program are:

- constructing or upgrading community infrastructure that fills an identified gap or need for community infrastructure;
- contributing to achieving a wide range of community socio-economic outcomes; and
- is strategically aligned with regional priorities.

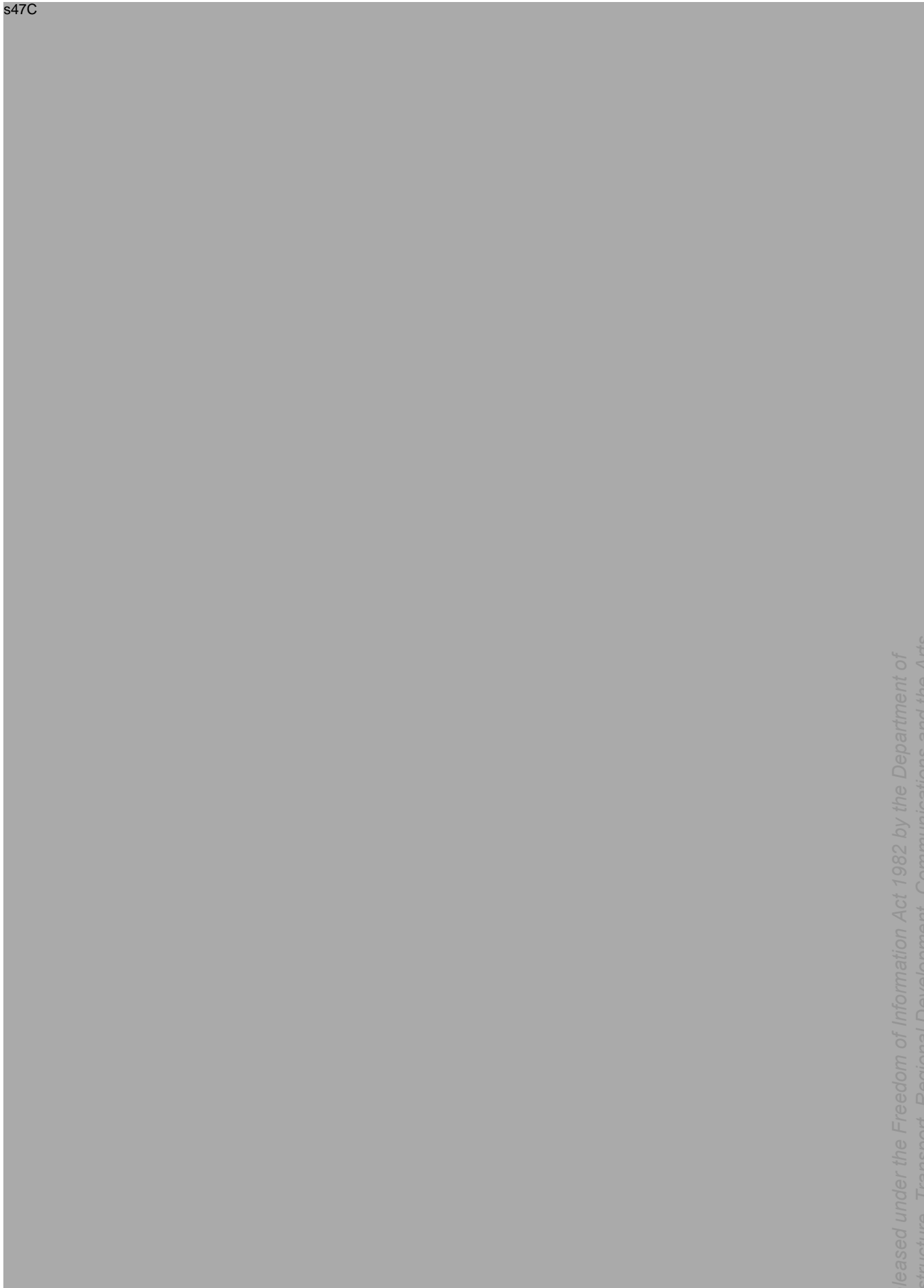
10. The intended outcomes of the program are:

- delivery of community-focused infrastructure which contributes to local and regional priorities;
- provision of infrastructure which benefits the community by improving equity and supports diverse social inclusion;
- to contribute to the achievement of broader Government priorities such as net zero emissions, gender equity, and/or First Nations priorities; and
- growing local economies and enhancing amenity and liveability in the regions.

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**Funding recommendations – FFSP Act, PGPA Act and CGRGs**

26. The CGRGs require we advise you that:

- a. the spending proposal is a grant;
- b. the merits of the proposed grants relative to the program guidelines and value for money (**Attachment A**); and
- c. outline the applicability of the PGPA Act and the CGRGs including any reporting obligations and advise on the assessment and selection process (**Attachment C**).

27. In approving these recommendations, you are acting in accordance with section 32B of the FFSP Act which gives the power to spend relevant money for programs listed in Schedule 1AB of the Financial Frameworks (Supplementary Powers) Regulations 1997.

28. In approving these recommendations, you are also acting in accordance with section 71 of the PGPA Act which provides that you must not approve a proposed expenditure of relevant money unless you are satisfied, after making reasonable inquiries, that the expenditure would be a proper use of relevant money.

**Program application and selection process**

29. An outline of the application and assessment process including the selection criteria is at **Attachment C**.

30. The BGH ranked applications based on individual and aggregate scores and provided the department with a merit assessment summary report listing applications from highest to lowest (**Attachment A**).

31. The department has reviewed the BGH’s merit assessment and considered value for money, alignment to program objectives and geographical spread to recommend applications for funding. An outline of this process is at **Attachment C**.

32. Table 1 provides a breakdown of the department’s recommended funding distribution by geographic area with a comparison to Regional Australia’s population distribution.

**Merits of the proposed grants**

33. The department is satisfied the recommended projects fall within the available funding envelope, represent value for money, and are an efficient, effective, economical and ethical use of resources consistent with the policies of the Commonwealth.

**Approver’s responsibilities**

34. In accordance with the guidelines you are responsible for making decisions, taking into account the BGH’s merit assessment, the department’s recommendations and whether the projects can be accommodated within the Round 1 funding envelope of \$300 million.

35. As the decision maker you need to be satisfied the spending proposal will be an efficient, effective, economical and ethical use of public resources.

36. As the decision maker you need to be satisfied with the results of the BGH’s merit assessment, the department’s assurance of geographic and socio-economic equity and the department’s recommendations total \$299,732,718.00 (**Attachment A**).

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**Grants in the Minister’s electorate**

38. There are no recommended grants within your electorate. Consistent with the CGRGs, you may approve grants within your own electorate. Where you exercise the role of approver for grants awarded in your own electorate, you must write to Senator the Hon Katy Gallagher, Minister for Finance, advising of the details. Should you require this, a sample letter is provided at **Attachment D**.

**Approving grants that are not recommended by the department**

39. As the decision maker you may approve grants not recommended by the department.

40. Under the Growing Regions Program – Round 1 Grant Opportunity Guidelines, applicants cannot use funding from other Commonwealth grants to fund the same project. The department has reviewed the recommended projects against the department’s other community infrastructure grants programs to ensure no duplication of funding. The department also reviewed recommended projects against proposed meritorious Batch One regional Precinct and Partnership Program (rPPP) applications and no duplication of funding exists. However, there is a risk of duplication of funding should you chose to fund projects not recommended by the department in either Growing Regions or rPPP. Projects that applied for both Growing Regions and rPPP are highlighted in **Attachment A**.

- a. If you choose to select grants not recommended by the department, a review of any potential funding duplication will be conducted and provided to your office.

41. Consistent with the CGRGs, you are required to report annually to the Minister for Finance on all instances where you have decided to approve a particular grant which was not recommended for funding. The report must include a brief statement of reasons and be provided to the Minister for Finance by 31 March each year for the preceding calendar year. Should you require this, a sample report is provided at **Attachment E**.

**Financial impacts**

Round 1 of the Growing Regions Program is allocated \$300 million.

Successful project proponents may express concern about their capacity to deliver projects by 31 December 2025 to allow for the program to be acquitted and close on 30 June 2026. To address this issue the department may need to extend the program which would require policy authority from the Prime Minister and a Movement of Funds to move program funding into Financial Year 2026-27.
