#### **Additional Information**

The two stage capital works approval process provides Government approval of funding and the Public Works Committee approval process provides public scrutiny of proposed public works.

Two Stage Capital Works Approval Process

New Policy Proposals from corporate Commonwealth entities (such as SBS) for capital works which are estimated to have a whole-of-life cost of \$30 million or more (excluding fit-out), are subject to the Department of Finance's two stage capital works approval process.

The first stage approval process involves seeking the Government's in-principle agreement for a capital works project and securing the necessary funding to develop a detailed business case for further consideration by Government. The purpose of the Second Stage Approval Process is to secure Government approval and funding for implementation and delivery of a project in accordance with the detailed business case.

Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works

Under the *Public Works Committee Act 1969*, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works is required to consider the purpose, need, scope, cost effectiveness, any expected revenue and public value of proposed public works and report its findings to Parliament.

Public works exceeding \$15 million (GST exclusive) must be referred to the Committee. Public works between \$5 million and \$15 million (GST exclusive) are required to provide a medium works notification to the Committee.
