Latest News

Supporting the IOT's fishing future



Local voices are continuing to help shape fishing management for Christmas Island (CI) and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI), with the renewal of membership of the CI and CKI Fisheries Advisory Committees (FAC) by Minister for Territories, Kristy McBain.

The FACs were first established two years ago following the introduction of amendments to fisheries legislation, with the aim of providing advice to the Minister on the administration of fisheries legislation in the IOT.

How much, where and what to sustainably fish in the waters around Christmas Island and the Cocos Islands is a delicate balancing act between meeting the needs of the communities, and protecting the fragile Indian Ocean ecosystem of our region now and for the future.

Membership of the FACs mirrors membership of the Christmas Island Fisheries Management Committee (FMC) and Cocos Marine Care (CMC), ensuring we are bringing local knowledge and expertise to the committees at a time where changing climate and environmental conditions mean that the regulation and management of our marine ecologies have never been more vital.

Due to a successful two years at the helm, the Minister has offered reappointment to the existing chairs of both FACs - Azmi Yon at CI and Aindil Minkom at CKI, both of whose leadership and experience will continue to support the effective running of these committees.

The CI FAC sees reappointment of eight existing members and the appointment of one new member, while the CKI FAC sees reappointment of 11 existing members. This reduces the total membership across the two FACs by five people, in line with the current FMC and CMC memberships.

Thank you to all members for their service over the past two years, and welcome to our new committee member who, along with reappointed members, will continue the important role of providing advice on how to refine and form fisheries management practices over the next two years.

The Australian Government supports the FACs and provides funding to the Shire of Christmas Island and the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands for the delivery of fisheries services to the IOT.

Have your say on the future of our marine parks

Parks Australia is seeking comments on draft management plans for the Christmas Island and Cocos Keeling Islands Marine Parks, and I encourage all of you to read, review and offer your thoughts.

The draft management plans will be open for public comment until 19 September, giving locals a say on how to best protect and manage these unique and special marine areas over the next decade.

The focus of the draft management plans include:

- Protecting, researching and monitoring park habitats and climate change adaptation.
- Community stewardship, by supporting the traditional practices of the local communities and forming of local committees to guide implementation of the plans.
- Implementing the zoning that was co-designed with local communities during the process to create the parks, with large offshore green zones, where fishing isn't allowed, and inshore yellow zones, that enables small scale fishing.
- Management that helps protect park values while simplifying administrative processes for local communities and other park users.

The draft plans have been informed by public comments, science, research and monitoring projects, and were prepared in close consultation with on island community advisory committees, as local communities maintain strong connections to our marine environments and are their main users.

With our marine parks making up 744,070 square kilometres of vibrant coral reefs which sustain over 680 fish species and marine fauna found nowhere else on Earth, the finalisation of these plans will provide clear and effective protection and management for the Christmas Island and Cocos Island Marine Parks for the coming decade.

The breakfast was a fantastic opportunity to discuss the impact of a life of public service, the importance of staying active, and having a voice in the local community with our emerging leaders.

Thank you to everyone who made the breakfast possible, and a particular thank you to Lisa, for making the journey over to Christmas Island, to see first-hand our community, our school and our wonderful students.





Health Speed Dating

The Indian Ocean Territories Health Service had the pleasure of hosting a health speed dating event on Christmas Island as part of the 2024 Seniors Week celebrations, resulting in a morning filled with knowledge, laughter, and connection.

36 seniors gathered at the Poon Saan Hall and the event kicked off with a lively game with Mr. Saw taking the prize. With the ice thoroughly broken, the seniors were divided into five groups, ready to rotate through a series of health stations. Presenters had just 10 minutes to share their expertise, making each session a whirlwind of valuable information.

Dr. Hafiz, a locum GP, spoke about the importance of advanced health care planning, emphasising the fact that the clinical staff at the hospital were always available to help develop these essential plans.

Dr. Tina, the new local dentist and her assistant Megs, highlighted the significant impact of poor oral health on the elderly, explaining how it could affect overall well-being. Dr. Tina also outlined the oral health services available on Christmas Island, with each senior receiving a voucher for a free dental check-up and clean.

As a dedicated social worker, Lea introduced herself and her role, highlighting how she can assist seniors and what support and resources she can offer. She also shared mindfulness techniques, providing valuable tips for mental well-being.

Health worker Ratu brought enthusiasm to her session on falls prevention. She shared practical advice on reducing fall risks, such as choosing the right footwear, having regular eye exams, using assistive devices like walking sticks or frames, and getting assessed for home modifications such as handrails.

Medical students Paige and Carlson brought a youthful vibrancy to their session on preventing chronic diseases. They covered a range of topics, from the importance of a healthy diet and regular exercise to staying hydrated, avoiding smoking, limiting alcohol, managing stress, staying socially engaged, getting enough sleep, and taking medications as prescribed.

As the sessions concluded, the seniors gathered for a delicious morning tea. The room was filled with the sounds of lively conversation and laughter as they networked with each other and the presenters.

Thanks to the hard work of our health workers and presenters, the event was a resounding success. Special thanks also to the Shire of Christmas Island for allowing the Indian Ocean Territories Health Service to be part of Seniors Week. This event not only provided valuable health insights but also strengthened the bonds within our senior community.

Banking Support Review for Cocos

Banking support for remote communities can prove challenging due to the distance from branches, and this issue has been raised with me by residents of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI).

I have been engaging with the Commonwealth Bank to seek options for how locals can better access banking services from Cocos and am pleased that they have agreed to review the support required by Cocos Island residents.

After advocating for the local community, the Commonwealth Bank has agreed to two on-island visits to CKI over the next 12 months, with one expected by the end of 2024.

While the details are still being finalised, this is a fantastic outcome for the residents of Cocos who have been disadvantaged with routine banking access due to their remote location.

I look forward to continuing to work with CBA on timing and logistics and will keep the community updated as we progress these visits over the coming weeks.





National Rugby League (NRL) WA coach, Gethin Thomas was well received during his recent visit to the Indian Ocean Territories in July, with community comeand-try days for league touch and league tag to promote the sport. League touch has been so popular on Christmas Island (CI), it is now played weekly since Gethin's visit.

On CI, 144 students from year groups 2 to 12 participated in activities including the skills of passing, catching, kicking and evasion. On the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, 114 students from pre-primary to year 10 participated in similar sessions. Some students received an NRL-themed pencil case to help promote NRL and increase club registrations.

Gethin also conducted club training sessions which were well attended on both CI and CKI. Participants were taught fundamental skills of the game as well as engaging in modified formats including league touch and league tag.

Footballs were provided to the community clubs to ensure they could be used for training across all age groups. Two coaches on Christmas Island gained their Community Coaching Accreditation for ages 6 to 12 which will benefit local young players. Club volunteers were provided with LeagueSafe shirts to ensure recognition and responsibilities on game day.

The Australian Government funds the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries to bring sporting activities to the IOT. These visits would not be successful without on-island support from the IOT Shires and schools and local sports organisations, like the CI Robbers Club.





Nailed it! - New Christmas Island hospital roof progressing

The replacement roof for the Christmas Island hospital is well on its way, with 2,300 square metres of reroofing already completed, and just 700 to go.

Acker has now progressed to the final stage with the aim of installing the hot water system and having the final section of the roof over the community health area of the hospital completed by the end of the year.

We are also progressing the air conditioning replacement.

We will keep the community updated as this essential work on the health service is finalised.

Christmas Island water and wastewater infrastructure upgrades

The Australian Government continues to invest in the water security of Christmas Island, with preparations under way to finalise the Summit tank to Drumsite tank water main replacement, which is critical infrastructure on the Island.

The department recently engaged Water Corporation to complete Stage 2 of the water main replacement project. This project allows for the remaining approximately 1.5km of water main to be replaced and

support the sustainability of the Island's water security. The initial 4 km of the pipeline was successfully commissioned in September 2023.

Another project is taking place where a wastewater main is being realigned away from the rock fall area in the Kampong, with a new alignment along Jalan Pantai. Project works are expected to be undertaken after the wet season in April/May 2025.

The community will be kept informed about these projects as they progress.
