Connecting our external territories

Earlier this month, I was pleased to be able to host George Plant, Administrator of Norfolk Island, for his first visit to the Indian Ocean Territories.

As the Administrator of Australia's other external territory, having George visit helps to build on our commonalities and shared issues. It has enhanced our understanding of where we can work together, on similar challenges and priorities.

We will continue to meet regularly and lay the groundwork for a strong, enduring relationship between our communities.

While on-island, George toured infrastructure and held meetings with a broad range of stakeholders, including the Shires of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands, other agencies and departmental staff – both learning from the local context and imparting his own experiences in governance and management of small, remote island communities.

During his visit, George also got to see first hand the extraordinary natural environment of our region and was able to experience the best that the IOT have to offer.

We thank everyone who met with George and shared their knowledge and experience, making it an invaluable trip.





Air services update

The Australian Government, in partnership with Virgin Australia, are scheduling an additional full circuit flight to the Indian Ocean Territories (IOT), in time for the mid-year school holidays.

The new passenger flight will operate on 29 June 2024, departing from Perth and stopping on Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, before returning to the mainland.

Flight timings will be released closer to the date and are subject to regulatory approval.

Virgin Australia will also be making additional changes to check-in, with a new 60-minute closure time before the scheduled time of departure out of Perth. This aligns Perth check-in closure with the existing

arrangements out of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands from 1 April 2024.

The new closure time for check-in will support more timely flight departures and allow additional time for baggage handling processes for checked luggage.

To help travellers adjust to the new check-in closure time for Perth, the 60-minute deadline will not be strictly enforced until 1 June 2024, however we encourage all passengers to check in as soon as possible to avoid delays.

The Government will continue to work with its service providers to support essential air services to the IOT, responding to demand and changing circumstances as needed.

International Women's Day in the IOT



Earlier this month, the women of the Indian Ocean Territories celebrated International Women's Day with a number of different events.

On Thursday the 7th of March, I attended the Christmas Island Women's Night, hosted by the IOT Health Service. It was an informative evening of fun, with mocktail making, line dancing, boot camp and almost 20 stalls where myself and about 170 other women were able to find out about the services and groups available on island. The evening was rounded out with dinner, followed by an energetic Zumba

session where we all got out hearts pumping and bodies moving.

The following morning, I took part in a discussion panel for an IWD Networking Breakfast, hosted by PRL and presented by local counsellor Beth Rad. Also on the panel were Australian Federal Police Officer Braidee Bell and Community Development Officer Suzanne Chan, from the Shire of Christmas Island.

It was a great opportunity to hear from the other panelists and to share my own experiences as a woman growing up and working on Christmas Island. Many issues were discussed, including the importance of access to services and education for women in remote communities, the challenges of working in male dominated industries, and advice for young women starting out in their careers.

Later that day, on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, local women gathered on Home Island to celebrate a colourful Barbie themed night of games, dancing, and a dessert competition to celebrate International Women's Day. I would have loved to attend this event, but I was pleased to be able to send a video message to the women of Cocos, to wish them a wonderful night.

I would like to take a moment to thank and acknowledge the hard work of so many for putting these events together, including Zoey McMillan, Taisha Cusack, Amy Rossbach, Jacqui Fidler, Stephanie Sambell, Stevhnie Nel, Lea Pedersen, Amy McDonald and Nadya Adim. Thank you also to the team at the CI Recreation Centre for their professionalism and assistance during both events on Christmas Island, and thank you to our various on island businesses and individuals who provided in-kind contributions that made the events a success.

This year's events reminded me of how many talented and capable women we have in the Indian Ocean Territories. It was a wonderful way to celebrate and recognise the important role that women have and continue to play in our region's future.

Play Our Way - A huge opportunity for our local girls and women

The Australian Government is making a significant investment in women's sports by backing the talent, hard work and aspirations of women and girls across our communities through the \$200 million Play Our Way grant program.

With the success of the Matildas in last year's history-making and record-breaking FIFA Women's World Cup, women's sports have never been more popular nor the momentum so strong to see more equitable access and to break down the barriers for girls and women in sport.

The Play Our Way program is a significant stride forward, promoting equal access, more suitable facilities and grassroots initiatives to get women and girls engaged and participating in sport throughout their lives.

The grants will be available in 2 streams:

- **Facilities:** For projects that establish and improve sporting facilities for women and girls and further encourage them to take part in sport and physical activity by better meeting their needs.
- Participation and equipment: For programs that encourage women and girls to participate and remain involved in sport and physical activity for life, by tackling barriers such as disadvantage or lack of equipment, and for programs that will lead to sustained cultural change in sport.

I encourage anyone who is interested to read over the grant guidelines and make a submission. The Play Our Way program is an opportunity for our Shires, community organisations and sporting organisations to make real, local and long-lasting changes to women's sports here in the IOT, and give women and girls opportunities to showcase their passion, skills and dedication in the sporting arena.


