Latest News

A welcome visit







Earlier this month, we welcomed Minister for Resources and Northern Australia Madeleine King, and Special Envoy for Northern Australia Luke Gosling to Christmas Island for a flying visit. Recently, the Australian Government announced that both Christmas Island and the Cocos Islands were included as part of Northern Australia for the purposes of the Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF), giving access to concessional low interest loans to assist with economic and social development.

The Ministerial visit was arranged as an opportunity for Minister King and other government representatives to see the island in person and learn more about the work being undertaken to diversify our economy, as well as discuss further opportunities for development.

I always welcome the opportunity to showcase our remarkable community during such visits, and was pleased to be able to provide a local perspective during my conversations with Minister King and Mr Gosling MP.

Christmas Island is uniquely placed not only due to our strategic location, but for our abundant natural resources, and I look forward to seeing how we can continue to build on our economic, social and scientific potential through the Economic Future Working Group.

Though the visit was brief, Minister King toured Cl's main infrastructure sites, and was able to take in the extraordinary nature of our island.

The delegation also met with the Shire and Phosphate Resources Limited Group, and was led on a tour of the rehabilitation mine sites, as well as Green Space Tech as an example of the innovative solutions we can achieve when industry and government work together.

Representing the IOT in Canberra







Earlier this month, I travelled to Canberra for meetings, to build connections, and to represent the Indian

Ocean Territories. It was wonderful to be able to meet with colleagues from the Canberra office face to face, including Department Secretary Jim Betts, and Deputy Secretary David Mackay.

During my time at Parliament House, I met with Minister for Territories Kristy McBain, which provided a valuable opportunity to discuss the issues affecting our region. I was also able to spend time with Marion Scrymgour MP and Minister Malarndirri McCarthy, who represent the IOT in both houses of Parliament. Senior Ministerial advisers and staff from government agencies also provided me with the opportunity to discuss topics such as the runway upgrade on Cocos, regional development, and import and export conditions for the IOT.

The National Emergency Management Agency provided a fascinating insight into their work in managing and assisting communities in times of emergency. As the Chair of the Emergency Management Committees on both CI and CKI, I toured the NEMA facility in Canberra and discussed ways they could aid the IOT in the event of an emergency.

Other highlights of my trip were meetings held with the Ambassador of Indonesia and the Deputy High Commissioner of Singapore. At both meetings I was able to discuss the ties between the IOT and these neighbouring countries, as well as emerging and future opportunities.

It was an extremely busy, but rewarding visit to Australia's capital city. I feel privileged to have been able to represent the Indian Ocean Territories and to have developed relationships and connections that will continue into the future.

Be alert for avian influenza





High pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI), also known as bird flu, is a viral disease of birds.

Not only are wild, migratory birds vulnerable to avian influenza, but also domesticated bird species, such as chickens, turkeys and ducks.

Outbreaks overseas of a new strain of bird flu, H5N1 HPAI, have led to extensive losses of poultry, and mass mortalities of wild birds and mammals, particularly marine mammals and mammals that prey or scavenge on birds.

Here in the Indian Ocean Territories, we are faced with a unique series of threats posed by the global outbreak of bird flu.

Not only do we have wild populations of jungle fowl and feral chickens on both Christmas and Cocos Islands, we are also a stopover point for many migratory birds returning to their local summer breeding and feeding grounds.

While Australia and Indian Ocean Territories are currently free from the H5N1 HPAI strain, there is a risk it may arrive with those migratory species.

Rapid detection and response will be vital to contain any potential outbreaks.

If you notice anything suspicious make sure to report it immediately, and please avoid any contact with sick or dead birds:

Signs to look out for in wild birds:

Signs of disease usually appear in several or all birds in a flock, including:

- sudden death
- lethargy or reluctance to walk, eat or drink
- droopy appearance or ruffled feathers
- head or limb swelling
- bruising of the wattle, comb, feet or skin
- respiratory signs such as panting, nasal discharge or sneezing
- diarrhoea
- unusual head or neck posture, incoordination, inability to walk or stand

• unusual reduction in egg production.

Avian influenza can only be confirmed through laboratory testing of samples collected by a veterinarian or government animal health officer.

New vessel names revealed

I am delighted to share the names of the new Cocos barge as well as the back-up ferry and rescue vessel, replacing the RJ Hawke.

For the barge, the name Harapan Cocos, meaning Cocos Hope in Cocos Malay was selected. This is a name that celebrates the islands, and the indomitable spirit of the Cocos community.

After much consideration, and confirming support from his family, the name Maz Hamiril, in honour of the late Mazlan Hamiril, was selected for the ferry.

Maz was a proud Cocos Islander with a passion and commitment for his community. He worked on both the previous barge and the RJ Hawke, and naming the new ferry after Maz celebrates his life and love of his island home.

Thank you to everyone who submitted a name for the new vessels, with their construction continuing.

I look forward to seeing the Harapan Cocos and the Maz Hamiril on the waters once launched.





New Federal Administrative Review Tribunal



A new, fit-for-purpose federal administrative review body will commence operations on 14 October 2024, replacing the Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT).

The Administrative Review Tribunal (ART) will implement reforms to Australia's system of administrative law to deliver high quality and accessible review of Government decisions for all users.

The jurisdiction of the ART will be the same as the AAT, which reviews decisions under a number of Acts and interests, including those related to child support, social security and the NDIS, workers' compensation, migration and refugee visas, taxation, security and veterans' entitlements.

The new tribunal will continue to review decisions in a way that is designed to be user-focused, efficient, accessible, independent and fair – resolving applications in a timely manner, being accessible and responsive to diverse needs of parties and improving the transparency and quality of government decision-making.

Legislation to abolish the AAT and replace it with the ART passed the Parliament in May 2024, and is part of the Australian Government's reform agenda for Australia's system of review. All matters currently before the AAT will continue as usual and will automatically transition to the ART upon its commencement in October.

Indian Ocean Territories residents who have applied to the AAT for review of a decision do not need to submit a new application. All AAT decisions that have already been finalised will not be considered again by the ART.

The Honourable Justice Emilios Kyrou AO is the inaugural President of the ART, having been appointed President of the AAT on 9 June 2023, and will lead the new Tribunal through the transition.

Turning the tide on pollution – helping clean up Cocos' beaches

With breathtaking coral, crystal clear water and palmfringed white sands, the beaches of Cocos are some of the most beautiful in the world.

Just ask beach expert Brad Farmer who declared Pulu Blan Madar Island the fifth most beautiful beach in all of Australia earlier this year. However, like so many of the world's most beautiful places, Cocos' beaches are not untouched by pollution.

Plastic presents a huge challenge for our marine environment, as not only does it not decompose, it breaks down into smaller pieces called 'microplastics,' which pass through our waterways and into the ocean, often mistaken for food by our marine wildlife.

Jones Lang LaSalle, the property management contractors for the Australian Government in the Indian Ocean Territories, recently held a beach clean-up activity during a trip to the Cocos Islands to try to combat the influx of plastic pollution.

The clean-up saw more than 100kg of small plastics – eighteen trash bags worth – collected from one of our beautiful beaches.

The team of eight – including WA managing director Angelo Amara and head of property and asset management Richard Fennell – were joined by their contractors on island for this massive effort – picking up bottle tops, straws, plastic soup spoons, soy sauce tubes, cigarette lighters and too many plastic bottles to count from the shore.

Thanks to Ian Harwood, Daniel Nunn, Arash Eshagi and Nico Visser from JLL's IOT account team, as well as Angelo and Richard for their clean-up efforts.

The trip also included a JLL-hosted barbeque for their local contractors.







Athletics for everyone

Cor Cordis Appointed Voluntary Administrators of Cocos Island Co-Op

Jeremy Nipps and Thomas Birch, of restructuring advisory firm Cor Cordis, have been appointed Voluntary Administrators of Cocos Islands Co-operative Society Limited on September 25, 2024.

Established in 1978, the Cocos Islands Co-operative Society is owned by Cocos Malay Muslim community

members and serves as the largest employer within the Cocos (Keeling) Islands. The Co-op provides logistics, hospitality, retail, and specialist contract services to its community.

Due to current economic challenges, the Directors have determined that in the best interests of the Coop, its members, its stakeholders, and the broader community that it serves, the appointment of Administrators was required with a view to restructuring its financial affairs and ensuring its continued operation into the future for the benefit of those parties.

On behalf of the Administrators, Jeremy Nipps stated, "We've commenced an urgent review of the Co-op's financial position and have held preliminary discussions with key parties to ensure we can stabilise operations and provide the best opportunity to develop a proposal to restructure the Co-op. There are no changes to the Co-op's day-to-day operations, and all its businesses will continue to operate as usual until further notice. We will update all stakeholders as we work through the voluntary administration process".

While the Co-op's businesses will continue operating normally and the Administrators and their team will strive to minimise disruptions, some operational adjustments may be necessary to maintain full-service delivery.

IOTPS provides regulatory compliance in collaboration with the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety.

The key responsibilities of the Mechanical Technician are to carry out inspection, preventative maintenance, repair, overhaul, modification, installation and testing of heavy duty diesel power generators; and maintain, service and repair power station auxiliary equipment. They will fault find, read and understand General Arrangement and Piping and Instrumentation drawings; maintain maintenance and inspection records in paper and computerised formats; and maintain a safe working environment at all times.


