

# 2024 Independent Review of the Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility Act 2016

# WHAT – Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility

The Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF) provides loans to finance infrastructure projects in northern Australia. It was established in 2016, and has so far invested more than \$4.3 billion to support 32 projects across northern Australia<sup>1</sup>.

The NAIF currently cannot make investment decisions after 30 June 2026.

### WHY - Review of the NAIF Act

The Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility Act 2016 states that a review must be undertaken as soon as possible after 30 June 2024.

The review will look at:

- whether the time limit of 30 June 2026 should be extended
- appropriate governance arrangements after that date – such as the products and supports the NAIF is able to offer, the roles and responsibilities outlined in the Act for the NAIF, the Department and Government and how the NAIF supports the delivery of benefits to communities across northern Australia.

The review may also look at other matters set out in the Terms of Reference.

Dr Lisa Caffery is based in rural Queensland and is board chair of Sunwater Ltd. She is a strategy, engagement and governance leader with expertise in large-scale and long-cycle public and social infrastructure projects.
