Re: National Urban Consultation Policy - Consultation Draft

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback in response to the community consultation on the Frankston Fair Access Policy and Action Plan.

The Victorian Pride Lobby is a community-based advocacy group that works towards equality, social justice and advancing human rights for the Victorian LGBTIQA+ community. In 2020, we launched the Rainbow Local Government campaign to recruit and support LGBTIQA+ candidates and allies to increase diversity and champion change on LGBTIQA+ issues in local government.

The Consultation Draft lists 'safety for marginalised groups' as a key urban challenge, stating that:

Certain groups, such as First Nations people, women and girls, people with disability, migrants and refugees, older people and LGBTIQA+ people, face higher risks to safety in public spaces. We need coordinated planning to address these risks.

In order to address this, we recommend that the possible actions be amended to insert the underlined words as follows:

- "support research and reporting on national urban safety priorities, including indicators that measure access, safety and cohesion <u>for marginalised groups</u> in cities in a placemaking context"
- "consider disaster and climate risk in land use planning <u>and how disaster and</u> <u>climate risk can have unique impacts on marginalised groups</u>"
- "Invest in place-based initiatives that seek to activate public spaces, especially for marginalised groups, whilst also improving community safety and addressing the underlying causes of crime"

The Consultation Draft also lists 'housing and homelessness' as a key urban challenge, stating that:

These persistent challenges in urban areas are particularly affecting marginalised communities, including First Nations people, people with disability, and low-income households.

We recommend that this be amended to insert 'LGBTIQA+ people', who also face higher rates of homelessness and housing insecurity.²

We would welcome the opportunity to discuss this matter with you further, and look forward to your response.
