Slow down. Look. Listen for trains.

As you drive through regional and rural towns, you will likely drive over a railway crossing.

Many regional railway crossings do not have boomgates, lights or bells to alert you a train is coming. They will only have a Give Way or Stop sign.

To cross safely, you need to do three things.

- 1. Slow down to follow the Give Way or Stop sign and check your surroundings.
- 2. Look for oncoming trains. They're fast and can be hard to see.
- 3. Listen for trains. You can often hear a train before you see it.
