



Slow down. Look. Listen for trains.

As you drive through regional and rural towns,
you will likely drive over a railway crossing.

Many regional railway crossings do not have boomgates, lights or bells
to alert you a train is coming. They will only have a Give Way or Stop sign.

To cross safely, you need to do three things.

1. **Slow down** to follow the Give Way or Stop sign and check your surroundings.
2. **Look** for oncoming trains. They're fast and can be hard to see.
3. **Listen** for trains. You can often hear a train before you see it.
