

# **CIRCULAR NO 23A-2-1**

# IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURE FOR ADR NO .23A-NEW PNEUMATIC PASSENGER CAR TYRES

#### Introduction

- 1. ADR 23A comes into force on 1 January 1984. The differences between ADR 23 and 23A are in the high speed test and the labelling requirements.
- 2. To reduce the amount of testing on tyres previously demonstrated to comply with ADR 23 the Board has agreed to a method whereby ADR 23 test results may be used for demonstrating compliance with some of the requirements of ADR 23A.

## **Implementation Procedure**

- 3. A tyre demonstrated to comply with ADR 23 will be accepted as complying with ADR 23A, if
  - a. its labelling meets the requirements of ADR 23A clause 23A.2.4, and
  - b. test evidence is submitted which demonstrates compliance with the high speed test of ADR 23A clause 23A.3.5.
- 4. For demonstration of compliance with ADR 23A on the above basis, information required in Tyre Test Report (form CB23 Annex A Part 1) sheets 1, 5 and 6 is to be submitted with the following amendments, made to this form.
  - a. Sheet 1-ADR No .in title to read 23A instead of 23 and the cross referenced ADR 23 Tyre Test Report No .clearly identified at top center of sheet, and
  - b. Sheets 5 and 6 appropriate changes made to test speeds and units to reflect the relevant ADR 23A requirements.

## Laboratory

5. A laboratory approved by the Board for conducting tests to ADR 23 will be deemed to be approved for ADR 23A testing.
